

## **Know Your Voting Rights**

### **When you vote you have the right to:**

- Vote by yourself
- Make your own choice
- Choose someone to help you vote
  - This can be a family member, caregiver, guardian or poll worker
- Vote using an accessible machine that provides you with privacy

### **ALL VOTING SITES MUST BE ACCESSIBLE TO ALL REGISTERED VOTERS INCLUDING THOSE WITH SPECIFIC NEEDS**

### **You can vote in New Mexico if:**

- You are a United States Citizen living in New Mexico
- You are at least 18 years old by Election Day
  - June 2, 2020 for the Primary Election
  - November 3, 2020 for the General Election.
- You have not had your right to vote removed by a Judge
- You are not in jail for a felony conviction or on parole for a felony conviction

### **You can register to vote in the following ways:**

- Register on-line by visiting [sos.state.nm.us](https://sos.state.nm.us)
  - Select **Voter Registration Information** from the list on the left margin
  - You will need a current or expired New Mexico Driver's license or state ID
- Register by mail
  - Request a registration form from your County Clerk's office or the Secretary of State's office

- You will need to submit a copy of a current and valid photo ID and Proof of residence
  - Driver's license or state ID
  - Utility bill, government check or paycheck, student or Tribal ID card
- You can mail your completed registration form to your local county clerk's office or the Secretary of State's office or you can drop it off in person.
- Register with any certified voter registration official
